The first of our "Wisdom" entries centers around Erle Renwick, Jr. (99 years old, born July 13, 1921). His father, Erle, Sr. wrote many poems, was a musician, who was taught piano by his mother. He was a professional opera singer and recitalist for a number of years; he studied opera in Italy as a Baritone.

He spent some early years developing real estate in St. Petersburg. Then came the singing career. Most of his career was in the life insurance business; he managed the Portland, ME, office of Phoenix Mutual Life Insurance for many years.

On the following pages, we present words from Erle Renwick, Sr. (January 19, 1896-June 28, 1972) recorded and presented to his grandson, Mark in September, 1966. Thus, the first "Wisdom of Old" that we share is from Grandfather to Grandson.

#### **Perfect Love**

"Mark, think on this, if you have perfect love in your heart, how can you ever hate anybody or anything that has life. Also how can you be angered at the mistakes of others, for what do they matter? If someone does you an injury, revenge or seeking to get even just makes the matter worse. If you still exude love in spite of anyone's mistakes or so called wrong doing, or slights, if you overlook those things, with love and do not try to get revenge, you grow in greater stature."



#### What is sin?

"Mark, how much sin can you commit if you are all alone on a desert island?"

'Not much,' said Mark. Everything committed against society, organized society, is a crime. Some actions are against what we call the natural laws of God. When what we do interferes with the natural laws of God, we call it sin. There is one sin, it is not recognizing your own divinity as a child of God. Everything else you do to others is a crime, but not following the teachings of Jesus is a sin."

#### **Divine Intelligence guides**

"Mark, you're living in a new house, your body is not very old and you've got the journey to complete. There's one thing to think about when you meet all sorts of objections and so forth. Realize that divine intelligence can always guide you and show you the way to do things. And when you believe that, you will learn the axiomatic truth of that statement made by the greatest philosopher of all time, 2000 years ago. When He said "all things are possible to him who believeth", it was exactly what He meant and the truth because all things are possible through this divine intelligence and when you are calm and free from worry and concentrate on a thing with love and no animosities and no hate for anyone, then you can be divinely inspired and do things provided that thing is good and for the advancement of everybody, including yourself of course.

That philosophy will carry you to any heights of success if you do it unselfishly and for the real reason for accomplishing good for the advancement of the working out of the divine purpose on this earth."

#### The Principle of Salesmanship – and getting along with people

A teaching moment for Mark: "If you're trying to make a sale with someone and he makes a statement, try not to disagree with him, even if you don't agree or it's something that isn't true. You can say "yes, but did you ever consider it this way?" Then show him something different. People don't like to be told they are wrong. When you contradict a person and say something else, it's sort of like punching them in the nose. Avoid arguments, don't say anything, let things rest. Listen. Even if you do disagree, don't emphasize it, state your point of view casually. Sometimes a person realizes they are wrong."
